



OSHA 10- & 30-Hour Training

One of the value-added services DMI provides to the colleges is OSHA 10-Hour and 30-Hour training. As an OSHA Outreach Trainer, I am authorized to provide this training to college employees. The cost to the colleges is minimal. The only charge is for processing the OSHA card for each attendee. The current cost is \$8.00 per attendee; however, OSHA is raising the processing fee to \$10.00 on October 1, 2023.

The 10- & 30- Hour courses provide a broad exposure to OSHA programs and regulations. The Wisconsin Technical Colleges fall under the jurisdiction of the Wisconsin Department of Safety and Professional Services, but the DSPS adopts the OSHA 1910 General Industry Standard. Training provided includes OSHA 1910 requirements such as Walking-Working Surfaces, Fall Protection, Emergency Action Plans, Exits & Evacuations, Personal Protective Equipment and Hazard Communication to name a few.

The content of these courses provides a great fundamental understanding of safety regulations for college employees. This is an opportunity to spread safety knowledge across the college campus and empower employees to take a leading role in supporting a strong safety culture. The training will help maintenance, custodial, and program assistants apply safe work practices to their daily tasks. Also including faculty, deans, supervisors and managers will provide safety leadership in advancing the implementation and sustainability of safety programs, policies and procedures.
