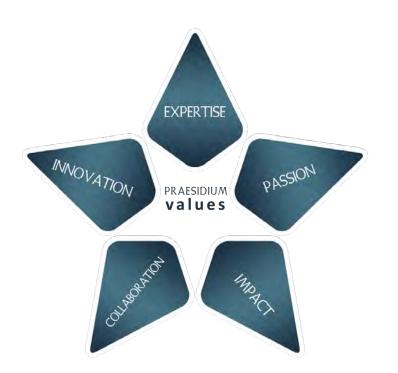

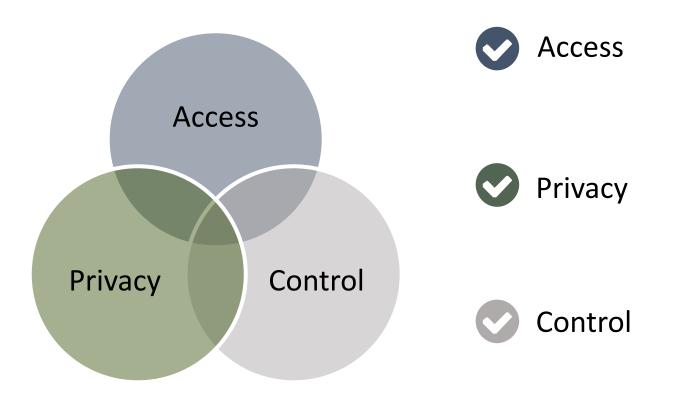

Managing Risk: The Challenges

- Policies may exist at campus, department, and/or program levels
- Unclear ownership of risk and quality control
- Divisional / departmental autonomy in program launch and risk management
- Diversity and volume of potential exposures, with relative ease of access
- Conflicting implementation priorities and limited resources

Managing these risks takes a sustainable, comprehensive approach that integrates everyone.

Engage Leadership and Embrace the Cause

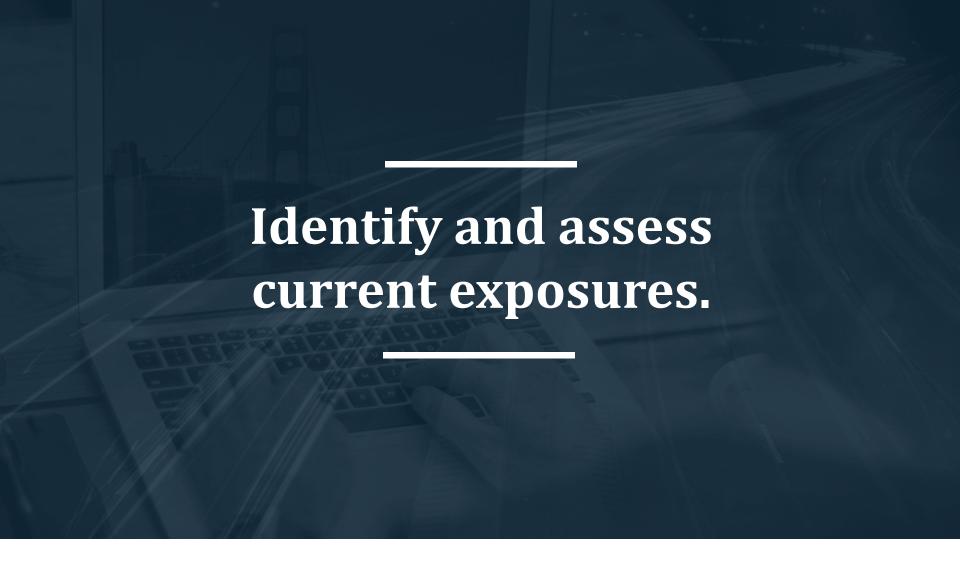
- Public commitment from the Office of the President / Chancellor
- Leadership training
- Identify who owns the initiative
- Voice from the top
- Gather genuine support



Identify a torchbearer and collaborate with an interdisciplinary team.



- Establish buy-in
- Guide the youth protection initiative
- Maintain collaboration
- Gather campus and departmental feedback

 - To guide abuse prevention efforts



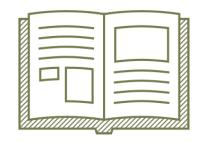
Overcome barriers to an effective survey

 You need the same level of policy adherence and understanding.



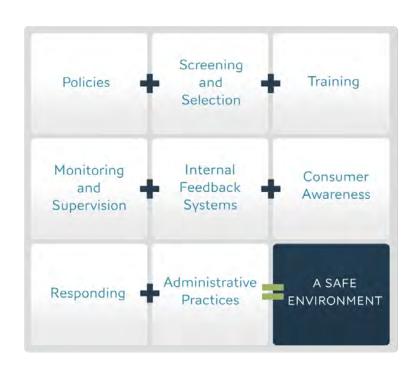

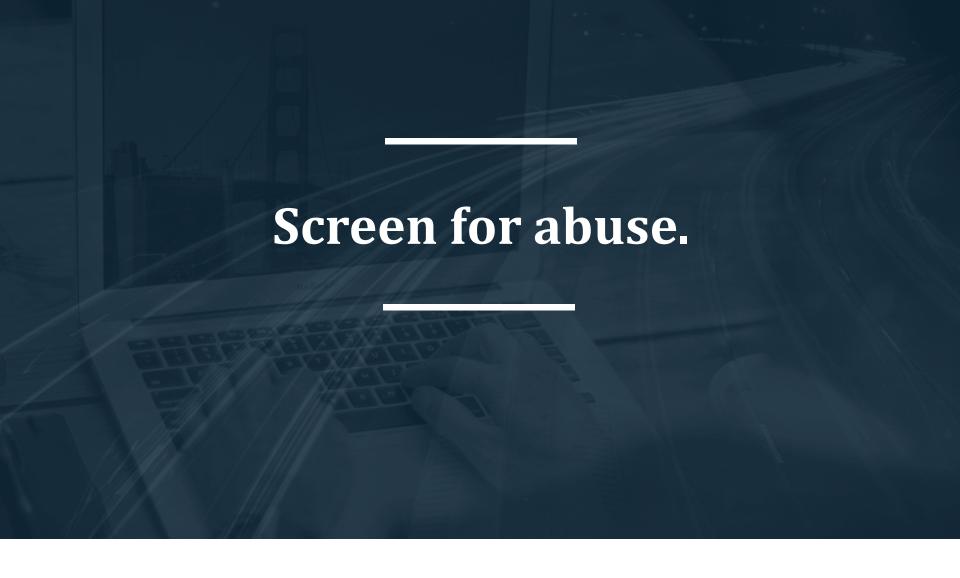
Campus-wide policies

- Response



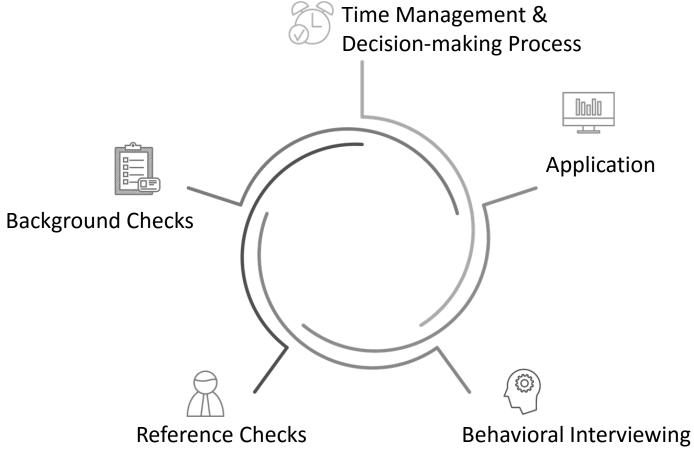

Do the Right Training at the Right Time

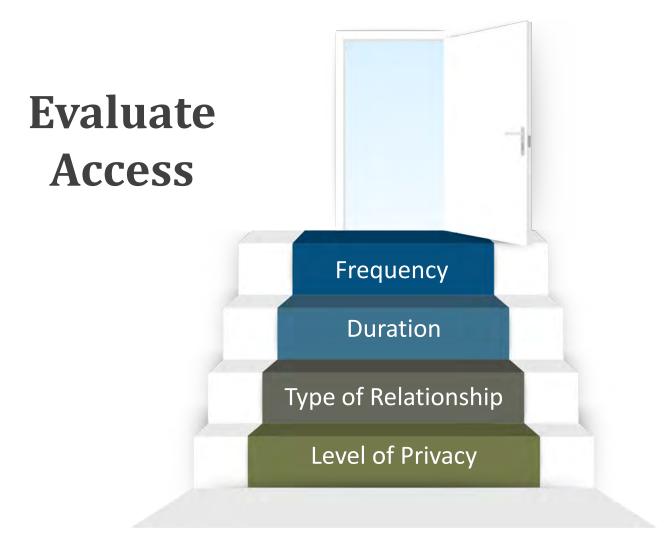
- The right content
- Easy to access and use
- Targets the right people the right way
- Easy to verify compliance



Screen and Train Based on Access

- Establish a process for determining who has access to minors.
- Follow applicable regulations.











Respond Immediately

- Implement a 3-prong procedure
- Respond to tremors not earthquakes
- Treat "near misses" as free lessons
- Don't respond in isolation
- Use a continuum of responses
