The process to renew DMI coverage is drawing to a close. The 2022/23 renewal policies are being assembled and reviewed for appropriate limits, endorsements, and deductibles. Your renewal policies are planned to be posted on your My College Page of the DMI website for access on Friday, July 1, 2022.

Auto ID cards for the 7/1/22-23 renewal will be available on the My College Page by June 28th. Please plan to remove the “old” ID cards and then replace with a new Auto ID Card in all college owned vehicles. You can print your college’s renewal Auto ID Card from the My College Page on the DMI website.

The insurance marketplace has been challenging and changing. The cyber liability line of coverage has been most difficult to navigate. Underwriting requirements have become highly selective. The colleges experienced firsthand the need for additional underwriting information through their submittal of supplemental applications. The colleges were thorough and timely with their responses to the several requests for follow-up information.

In the general commercial insurance market, cyber liability premium quotes for renewal have ranged from 80% to over 100%. The original renewal quote DMI received from our partner, Beazley, was for a 60% increase. After much discussion, the DMI Board of Directors decided to pass on a 20% increase in our cyber liability rate. By doing so, DMI will be paying \$354,000 on behalf of our cyber liability (network security) policyholders.

The DMI issued Network Security Policy includes **no change** in the College’s current limit or deductible. Sub limits **have not** been impacted. Given the “hard” cyber liability market conditions, this is considered a highly significant achievement.

The lingering effects of Covid 19 variants continue to be a risk management priority. The DMI team is planning to renew routine visits to the college campuses. The resumption of our routine college campus services is dependent upon several factors. As a Team, we are regularly conversing on when to resume routine travel. At this point travel is being planned and we are anxiously awaiting the opportunities to be back in person at your respective campus. We will continue to keep everyone posted on DMI Team travel planning.

As DMI begins our 19th year of partnership with the Wisconsin Technical Colleges, thank you for your continued collaboration, cooperation, and support.
